THE CHOIR SCHOOL

The Choristers are taught at the Choir School adjacent to the Cathedral, where they are part of a caring community.

Founded in 1432, it is now a two-teacher, co-educational school under the patronage of the Church of Ireland and provides education to pupils from third to sixth class.

Small class sizes provide an individual education in addition to which choristers enjoy a first-class instrumental and ensemble tuition provided by our team of visiting tutors.

Alternatively for parents wishing to continue their child's instrumental education privately, generous bursaries are available.



So that you can experience first-hand life in the oldest & largest choral foundation in Ireland we host a series of open afternoons throughout the year to provide an opportunity to see what is on offer: to enjoy a tour around the School, spend time discussing your child's individual needs with the Principal and then spend an afternoon with the choristers.

HOW TO APPLY

Admission into the Choir School is via a simple voice trial/audition and these are open to boys & girls aged 7-9. Whilst they would usually start in the Choir in the September of 3rd class, it is possible to start at other times depending on places available. Auditions are available throughout the year, and the staff are always happy to meet prospective parents informally, especially if they would like guidance about their child's potential for a choristership.
